Must be:

1. An enrolled member of a federally recognized tribe (may be required to show proof.)
2. Contestant must NOT be a current title holder, nor shall they apply if they have held the title in their category previously.
3. Contestants must be unmarried and have no children, dependents, nor be expecting dependents.
4. If crowned one of the Festival Royalty titles, you must represent the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes and Shoshone-Bannock Indian Festival whenever called upon throughout community events. The events may include conferences, banquets, local community powwows or cultural events.
5. Contestants/ title holder will remain drug, tobacco and alcohol free throughout the pageant and their reign.

Shoshone-Bannock Festival Royalty

Agreement, Requirements & Expectations

1. Contestants must be an enrolled member of a federally recognized tribe (may be required to show proof.)
2. Contestant must NOT be a current title holder, nor shall they apply if they have held the title in their category previously.
3. Contestants must be unmarried and have no children, dependents, nor be expecting dependents.
4. If crowned one of the Festival Royalty titles, you must represent the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes and Shoshone-Bannock Indian Festival whenever called upon throughout community events. The events may include conferences, banquets, local community powwows or cultural events.
5. Contestants/ title holder will remain drug, tobacco and alcohol free throughout the pageant and their reign.
6. ATTENTION: It is very important that you as a title holder of a Festival royalty title or attendant maintain a high level of moral standard for yourself, now and in the future.
 - a. You will serve as a positive role model and should refrain from any activities and behaviors that may be deemed unfavorable to the title.
 - b. If Royalty Committee, becomes aware or notified of any incidents where inappropriate content, posts, photographs/videos depicting negative activities on any website such as but not limited to Facebook, Twitter, Snapchat, Instagram, YouTube, ect., will result into an immediate investigation, see 6.c..
 - c. Should it be found true that an incident/violation was committed, the Royalty and/or Festival Committee may have the title holder relinquish her title.
7. All contestants and family members should show sportsmanship and a positive attitude during and after the competition. Furthermore, contestants and their family members will not fraternize with judges during the pageant. It is encouraged to have fun and be respectful of your fellow contestants.
8. CROWN CARE: The crown is the sole property of the Royalty/Festival Committee & the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes. If it is lost or stolen the Festival title holder and the parent/guardian will be held responsible for the cost to procure a new crown at the cost to be determined by the Royalty Committee. The crown itself must be worn with respect and should not be bent or folded while put away.
9. All pictures taken with the crown may be used by the Festival and Royalty Committee for promotional purposes.
10. Crowned title holders will report to the Royalty Committee monthly activities with the title every last Friday of the month on a format approved by the Committee. A Royalty Committee liaison will be assigned, reports can be submitted electronically to rteton@sbtribes.com
